and this is Tom


- Tom is 15.

 for teenagers
 from 14 17.



HOW CAN TOM **BE PUNIS**

The court

can







- · force him to get a job or an apprenticeship
- · force him to live in a residential home
- force him to work in social projects for a special time
- force him to take part in an anti-aggression course or a therapy
- force him to avoid the contact to special persons or special places



He also can be forced to ...

pay money to retrieve the damage or support the victim
help to repair things which were damaged by him



He also can be sent to a special youth jail

for :

- one or more weekends
- 2 days
- 1-4 weeks



For very brutal crimes teenagers can be sent to prison for 1-10 years.

 10 years is the limit, a longer imprisonment is not legal for teenagers



YOUNG PEOPLE FROM 18-21 :

- In this case the court (with help of psychologist and social workers) decides whether they should be punished as teenagers or adults.
- It depends on their level of maturity when they commited the crime.
