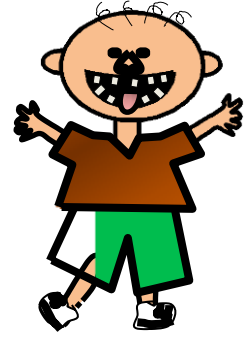

BOARD GAME

Age	Duration	Material
10-99	30-45 minutes	Game Board Poster Cards Dice

Objective: This game is intended for students that exhibit bullying behaviors and for those being bullied. The students will travel through the board game answering question cards that help them understand why it is not okay to bully and also help them learn how to handle bullying situations.

Pre-game directions: Make a copy of the game board, ways to stop a bully poster, question cards and question card covers. Cut question cards and covers. Glue the cover to each question card, laminate game, poster and question cards and cut.

Directions for playing the game: Have students roll a die to determine who should begin first. The person that begins the game will roll the die and move according to the number rolled.

If a player should land on a question card, the player will pick a question card, read it and answer the question.

Each card will indicate how many spaces the player should move forward if answered correctly. Students may refer to the,

“Ways to stop a Bully” poster for an answer.

If player lands on a bully, bully square, the player loses a turn. If the player lands on a bystander square, the player will move back one space, if the player lands on a good-by bully space *(meaning that they handled a bully correctly)*

they will move ahead 2 spaces. If a player lands on a blank square, they just stay there.

The player that reaches the square marked “finish” wins the game.



Ways to Stop A Bully

1. Tell the bully to stop.

2. Laugh it off

3. Walk away

4. Tell an adult

5. Stay away from places where bullies hang out

1. Always walk with someone else

2. Stay near adults



Julian's friends started sending him nasty text messages. He doesn't feel comfortable reading them. What should Julian do?

Move up 1 space

One of the boys in class is always asking Juan for money. He says that if he doesn't give him money he will hit him. What should Juan do ?

Move up 2 spaces

A girl on the bus will not let Sue sit anywhere near her. She starts to grunt when Sue gets close to her. Every one in the bus laughs when this happens. What can Sue do ?

Move up 1 space

There is a student at school that calls Mindy fat when she sees her in the playground. Mindy doesn't like being called names. What can Mindy do?

Move up 1 space

Every time Henry plays foot- ball the bigger boys push him around and call him shorty. What can Henry do to make them stop?

Move up 2 spaces

Betty would like to hang out with a certain group of girls but they always say that she can't. How should Betty handle that situation.

Move up 1 space

Every time Carla speaks in front of the class, she notices that a girl giggles. Carla feels very uncomfortable when she does that. How can she get her to stop ?

Move up 1 space

Steve wants to play basketball with a group of boys but they say that he can't play because he is not good at the game. What can Steve do to get them to allow him to play.

Move up 2 spaces

Ben is a good student with good grades. There are a group of boys that always make fun of him and call him a nerd. Ben would like for them to stop. What can he do ?

Move up 1 space

Every time Mark wears new sneakers, the boys in his class step on them and laugh. What can Mark do so this won't happen again?

Move up 1 space

Terry's friends make fun of her clothes everyday. They say she dresses weird? How can she get them to stop?

Move up 2 spaces

You are with a group of girls that suddenly begin laughing at another girl that is walking by. What will you do or say?

Move up 1 space

Diana's friends are laughing at her because she is wearing glasses. They are calling her four eyes? How can she get them to stop?

Move up 1 space

Ben would like to try out for the volleyball team but there is a bully on the team that always makes fun of him. What should Ben do ?

Move up 2 spaces

The boys start a fight in the playground. Everyone gathers around to see? What should you do?

Move up 1 space

Ted is afraid to go to school because a bigger boy always stares at him and asks him if he wants to fight. What can he do?

Move up 1 space

Mary feels that no one likes her because she is overweight. She tells her mother that the kids won't include her. What can Mary do?

Move up 2 spaces

Your friends only allow others to join their group if they wear designer clothes. You also wear designer clothes but you don't agree with what they are doing. What should you do?

Move up 1 space

You know that Bobby is afraid to come to school because someone is making threats to beat him up if he does not give them money. What can you do?

Move up 1 space

You like to say mean things to others especially when you see that they look scared. The school has threatened to send you to another school. You don't want to leave. What can you do ?

Move up 2 spaces

You see a group of boys take a cap away from a younger boy. They are tossing it back and forth. What should you do?

Move up 1 space

You heard a girl laugh and mimic another girl in class. You started to laugh too but began to feel guilty. What can you do now?

Move up 1 space

You overheard a group of boys talk about beating another boy up after school. What should you do.

Move up 2 spaces

You know that a group of bullies are hanging out by the left corner of the school. You see a little boy going in that directions.

What should you do?

Move up 1 space

You hang out with a group of kids that laugh and make fun of others. You don't feel comfortable when they do this. What can you do?

Move up 1 space

Your friend told you to help her keep a certain girl from sitting at the lunch table. What should you do?

Move up 2 spaces

Your friend starts to make fun of a girl walking by. You don't like the way your friend is acting. What should you do?

Move up 1 space

You hang out with bullies. Does that make you a bully?

Move up 1 space

Your friend acts really tough. He says he feels good when he makes someone feel afraid. Is he a bully?

Move up 2 spaces

Your friend likes to laugh and poke fun of others? Is she a bully?

Move up 1 space

Your friend enjoys picking on younger kids. Is he a bully?

Move up 1 space

Your friend is often in fights with others. He says he does not care if he gets in trouble. What can you do to help him?

Move up 2 spaces

You are friends with a bully because you are afraid he will bully you if you do not hang out with him. Is this right?

Move up 1 space

You often laugh when others make fun of someone. Does that make you a bully?

Move up 1 space

When you see others being bullied, you do nothing. You are a bystander. What should you do instead?

Move up 2 spaces

You never bully others but you enjoy seeing it happen. Does that make you a bully?

Move up 1 space

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
